



What is Collaboration?

Collaboration means to "coordinate, organize, or co-labor in such a way that our combined efforts produce more than our individual contributions."

- Root meaning of "collaboration" is to "co-labor".
- In I Corinthians 3:9 the term for **co-labor** is "**synergoi**", from which we get the word "**synergy**".
- Synergy occurs when the collective results are greater than the sum of the individual efforts.
- Collaborating or "Co-laboring" together creates synergy.

Collaboration allows us to scale our efforts and resources to the size and complexity of the challenge



What is Collaborative Action?

The process of connecting and organizing the diverse parts of the Body of Christ so it can work together to fulfill the Great Commission by accomplishing those things that no one part of the Body of Christ can do by itself.





Are You Ready to Collaborate?

- 1. Is there a clear need or reason to collaborate?
- 2. Is there an interest in collaborating?
- 3. Is there agreement on the problem and strategy for addressing it?
- 4. Is there a history of working together on projects?
- 5. Is there a spirit of generous collaboration or bitter competition?
- 6. Is there an openness and willingness to trust one another?

IF NOT, YOUR FIRST STEP IS TO ASK QUESTIONS, LISTEN, AND BUILD TRUST



Counting the Cost

Collaboration sounds good! We all agree that we should collaborate, yet we often don't. Why? **Collaboration is not free.** It takes commitment, energy, resources, and time to collaborate.

Tip: Be generous and collaborative, but wisely count the cost and don't collaborate just to collaborate. Choose when and how you collaborate. Collaborate with intention and purpose. Like the faithful master's servants invest the collaborative talents you are given wisely!


Four Strategic Questions

As a collaborative, you will need to have good answers to four questions throughout the life cycle of your effort.


- 1. What does God want done?

Movements



A movement is ...

- Loosely affiliated individuals or organizations (Low Structure)
- with shared interests and passion
- who informally connect and communicate, and
- Sometimes coordinate on activities of mutual interest

In missions, a common type of movements are Church Planting Movements (CPM) and Discipleship-Making Movements (DMM). These are indigenously-led, Gospel-planting, obedience-based discipleship processes that result in multiple generations of new churches and disciples.



Mission Networks

A mission network is ...

- a group of individuals or organizations
- with a common interest
- who connect, communicate, and collaborate together for mutual benefit
- toward a shared vision that is beyond the capacity of any individual partner









A mission partnership is ...


- a **group** of individuals or organizations
- with a common interest
- who regularly communicate and collaborate together
- to accomplish a shared vision and goal that is beyond the capacity of any individual partner

Partnerships function like a network, but with **additional structure** (agreements, goals, processes, projects) and **greater collaborative intensity** (more frequent communications, planning meetings, on-going projects). They are about organizing for action. Some networks end up becoming partnerships or starting partnerships around specific goals or projects.



Collaborative Action Teams

Collaborative Action Teams (CATS) are diverse groups of people who share a common interest in seeing a gap in the Great Commission closed by 2050 through Ministry collaboration.





Benefits of Collaboration



- 1. Discover others who share a **common vision**
- 2. Maximize resources
- 3. Reduce **duplication** of effort
- 4. Engage full range of spiritual gifts & skills
- 5. Facilitate trust-building, reconciliation, and unity
- 6. Share **risk**

Benefits of Collaboration



- 7. Access to **new ideas and information**
- 8. Demonstrate the **credibility** of the Gospel (by our love)
- 9. Release the **power** of the Holy Spirit (Psalm 133)
- 10. Provide community, encouragement and hope
- 11. Sustain **progress** when working on difficult challenges
- 12. Achieve **greater impact** than what can be accomplished alone



Satan loves to breakup collaboration and unity. Barriers to collaboration abound, but can also be managed!
